Although the summer always seems to go by so quickly, it is also nice for our kids to get back into those nightly routines of consistent bedtimes and daily activities. If your children are like mine, it's been an exciting first week, but they have come home pretty tired.

The start of the school year has been a smooth one. We welcomed 18 new students to our school but we also lost a few who have moved away. Overall, we are down a few students and sit at a total of 185 students from kindergarten to grade 6. Our staff remains fairly consistent from last year with only one change. Mrs. Kim Booth has transferred from V.P.E. and has moved a little closer to home, teaching at Arrowwood. We thank her for support of our school and her grade 5/6 class last year. Mrs. Jody Beagle has moved over from Arrowwood, where she was principal, and is now the Vice-principal and grade 5-6 teacher here at V.P.E.. This is the fourth time that Jody and I have worked together and I deeply admire her commitment and skill as a teacher. Great to have you back Mrs. Beagle!

We are getting right into the swing of things in terms of extracurricular activities. Starting Monday, we will begin our running club and Thursday, after school basketball starts. Intramurals, school patrol, x-country run and Terry Fox run will also occur in the month of September. Academics and providing a safe and caring for our students remain the focus for our students. V.P.E., like all schools in Pallier Regional Schools, continues to have a heavy focus on literacy. We will be tracking the progress of all of our students throughout the year and ensuring that every student continues to grow and progress as a reader. 
