Should leave \$10,000 - to be allocated to next years bussing requirements and trickster theater

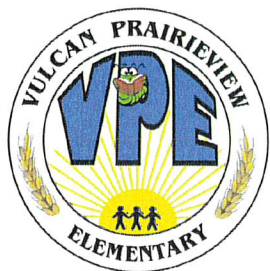
