EA's at Vulcan Prairieview school –4000 hours of EA time allocated to school – resulting in approx. 5 staff

Shane Cranston explained that every spring the school would go through each class and student – using a rubric system to gage level of need and support – use a scale between 3-5 5 being highest

They would receive the budget from province – allocated across the school division –

There are ongoing learning opportunities for EA's. It is occasionally a challenge to keep and recruit EA's. Palliser does their utmost to make sure the EA's are prepared for the job.

There has been 45 million allocated by the Provincial Government to address specific learning gaps in k-3. This will be an intensive program and the specifics for Vulcan Prairieview should be known next month.

 Staffing – Hired a making connections staff member starting in December - She is in charge of the entire Vulcan county, but would likely be spending approximately two days a week at Vulcan Prairieview.

She works on two main areas - <u>Promotion of mental health</u> – working with students – presentation in class, working with school. Working with fcss to bring in supports. And she <u>Connects family to school and community services</u> – She can assist families in accessing supports and removing barriers. She can help to access govt grants etc..

Student teachers will be starting soon
